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Message from the Chair & CEO

What an extraordinary year this has been.

Across Far North Queensland, our community came together with remarkable generosity, showing once again what can be achieved when people unite to support better healthcare.

This year, we celebrated the successful completion of the Donate for DaNi campaign, reaching the \$4.3 million community fundraising target to deliver Cairns Hospital's first surgical robot. Our Annual Donor Dinner also marked a record-breaking year, with the community contributing \$1.1 million in a single evening. This generosity enabled the Foundation to fully fund the \$800,000 ECMO stabilisation service, providing critically ill patients with faster access to advanced life support when every minute matters.

These landmark achievements were only part of the story.

During 2025–2026, the Foundation invested more than \$2.15 million into healthcare across Far North Queensland. This included modern equipment, improved facilities, research and education that will support better care for patients now and into the future.

Our Friends of the Foundation groups also continued to make a powerful difference in their local communities. Across 11 groups,

volunteers raised \$515,805 and invested almost \$424,000 into projects identified by local hospitals and health services. Together with Foundation-led fundraising, more than \$3.2 million was raised across the region during the year.

Every achievement in this report belongs to our community. It reflects the generosity of our donors, the dedication of almost 1,000 volunteers, the commitment of our healthcare partners, and the passion of our staff and supporters.

Our social enterprises also continue to play a vital role in the Foundation's work. Through our cafés, catering services, vending network and Cairns Hospital car park, we generate the income required to fund our operations. This means community donations can be directed towards improving healthcare, exactly as our donors intend.

As we look ahead, our focus remains on creating lasting impact. We will see the surgical robot installed, continue supporting delivery of the Cancer Care Hub, establish the ECMO stabilisation service and prepare to celebrate the Foundation's 30th anniversary in 2027.

During 2025–2026, the Foundation invested \$2.15 million in healthcare across Far North Queensland. From emergency and critical care to rehabilitation, diagnosis, cancer care and regional health services, your generosity helped clinicians provide safer, more effective and compassionate care.

Supporting equipment, facilities, patient and family support, research and professional education across Far North Queensland.

Every investment starts with a need. Your generosity helps turn that need into better care.

The Foundation's 2025–2026 investment included \$1.88 million in equipment, facilities, and patient, family and staff support; \$246,063 in research grants; and \$30,444 in staff education.



When every minute matters *Emergency & critical care*

Your generosity helped strengthen the equipment available to clinicians caring for seriously ill patients. Investments including an Airvo 3 bundle for the Emergency Department and a Mac-Lab Haemodynamic Recording System for Cardiology support rapid assessment, monitoring and treatment when time matters most.

Earlier answers. Better decisions *Diagnosis & treatment*

Modern diagnostic technology can help clinicians assess patients, plan treatment and make informed decisions. This year, your support funded portable ultrasound, neurological monitoring and cardiac diagnostic technology, strengthening access to contemporary diagnostic services across several specialist areas.

Care that supports recovery *Rehabilitation & patient care*

Recovery is about more than treatment. Equipment such as electric parallel bars and rehabilitation resources supports mobility, independence and confidence as patients work towards recovery. Investments in treatment and patient support also help create more comfortable, dignified experiences along the way.

Better care for children and families *Paediatrics & family support*

Healthcare can be an anxious experience for children and their families. Your generosity helped create more welcoming and supportive environments, including SmileyScope virtual reality devices to reduce anxiety during paediatric procedures, specialised paediatric oncology resources, ward murals and a virtual tour of the Special Care Nursery.



A story of impact

When Cheryl Campbell bought tickets in a raffle, she never expected to end up using the equipment she contributed to.

While Mrs Campbell knew she had a heart condition for many years, the rare pulmonary arterial hypertension was discovered quite recently when her unexplained breathlessness was investigated.

"It's just so ironic sitting here in this lung function testing box bought through the Cardiac Challenge, because I bought raffle tickets in Dr Vincent's fundraising for the event," Mrs Campbell said.

"I was actually jokingly cranky with him that I didn't win the raffle, but I won the prize in the end because I get to use the equipment," she said.

"And now I just feel wonderful. It's important that we have the same health services here in Cairns so that we don't have to travel south and we can be here with our loved ones."

20 years of the challenge 30 years of impact

In 2026, the Australian Retirement Trust Cardiac Challenge reaches an extraordinary milestone, marking 20 years since a simple idea became one of Far North Queensland's most enduring fundraising events. The ride began after Pete McNally, a heart patient and cyclist, imagined a way to raise funds for cardiac services closer to home. From that idea grew a three-day ride from Cairns to Cooktown, which has now raised more than \$6 million for cardiac and related services across the region.

As riders, volunteers and supporters prepare to take on the 319-kilometre journey for the 20th time, the milestone also is a reminder of what community support can achieve. The Cardiac Challenge has helped support a cardiac service that has grown from

four patient beds and one permanent cardiologist into a much larger team providing care across Far North Queensland, including rural and remote communities.

That spirit of community will continue into 2027, when the Foundation marks its 30th anniversary in March. To celebrate three decades of local giving, generosity and impact, a special gala is planned for March 2027. The event will honour the people, partnerships and fundraising efforts that have helped improve health services for patients and families across the Far North, while looking ahead to the next chapter of support for local health care. It will be a celebration not only of what has been achieved, but of the community that continues to make it possible.
